We mean we really love it! We hope you do too.


THE HOUSE



SNUG BAR

Everyone should have their own bar. Ours is honest and fully loaded, open to guests 24/7. It is snug and old skool cool. We looked local first - think Dartmoor botanical gin, rum, whiskey and Dorset milk vodka, next door's sparkling wine, Dartmoor ale and Devon cider. Then we chose Bio-dynamic wines selected for their flavour and credentials. Shake your own martini, pour your own beer. Play bartender, its a great game.

You can BYO if you have something special we do not stock, we do charge a corkage of £10 per bottle if you do.





CRAZYWELL POOL

WILD SWIMMING

Crazywell pool (40 min drive) Nr Princetown

This one is a pool with a legend behind it. Located in the middle of Dartmoor, it is rumored to be a bottomless haunted pool. In 'real life' it's an old shallow cast mine but I think a 'haunted pool of doom' sounds so much more exciting! It's located just south of Princetown. Its 3 mile walk into the wilds of Dartmoor so go prepared.

Switchwick Common (30 min drive) New Bridge, Ashburton

Near Ashburton, mountain clean peaty water, easy accsses, also known as Deeper Marsh, it has been a bathing place for generations. A great day out with Ashbuton nearby with great ammenities and antique shops. Our family fav. Features some very high cliff jumping too. Only for the brave.

Salmon Leaps (20 min drive) Nr Drewsteignton

A long river pool in the woods below Castle Drogo. The Teign cascades into three Victorian square stone plunge pools, each about 1m deep and smooth. Great for a pummelling massage.

Holne Pool (40 min drive) Holne

This pool has it's own mini waterfall so definitely worth a visit. It's a secluded spot located in Holne Woods, close to the village of Holne on the South Eastern side of Dartmoor.

ACTIVITES

Walk

So much choice. We offer a handmade book of 5 walks from the door but feel free to use our O.S maps and go off piste on your own route. There is so much vaired terrain here, rivers, moorland, fields, hills, reservoirs, beach and Tors. Walk for an hour or all day.

Ride

Depending on your bike, riding here is very diverse. Haldon Hill (20mins) is a great woodland park for off roading and you can hire bikes there. They also have a freestyle park, it's good for all ages and levels call www.forestcyclehire.co.uk We are just off the B3212 and B3193, 2 very challenging road bike routes.

Fish

Fly-fishing at the reservoirs – drop your day permit cash in the box and off you go. Also Fingle Bridge Inn offers day permits to fish in the river Teign – a totally gorgeous spot. You will need your own equipment to fish both these spots and a degree of experience. Trout fishing on Dartmoor is easy – we like Tavistock Lake www.tavistocktroutfishery.co.uk as they have a good kids pond to fish in, only fly fishing in the adult lakes all equipment can be hired here, Tavistock has a great pannier market.

Golf

There are many courses in the National Park from the glorious Bovey Castle <u>www.bovey-castle.com</u>, you can hire all your equipment from their Pro shop, it is expensive but a great course. The Teign Valley is our local course and only 5 minutes from the house <u>www.teignvalleygolf.co.uk</u>

BEACHES

Shaldon (25 min drive)

A crescent shaped beach, cliff backed with good rock pooling and epic crabbing at low tide. To get to the beach you have to go through an old smugglers tunnel. There is also a small Zoo <u>www.shaldonwildlifetrust.org.uk</u>. The particularly good Cafe Ode is based in the car park too <u>www.odetruefood.com</u>

Teignmouth (25 min drive)

On the other side of the Estuary to Shaldon, a wide beach at low tide, with good parking. A great kids play park and a very good kid friendly skate park. Head round to the Crab Shack <u>www.crabshackonthebeach.co.uk</u> for sunset over the water.

Bigbury on Sea (45min drive)

A stunning stretch of beach with a corridor of sand leading to Burgh Island with its Art Deco hotel and 13th Century pub. If the tide is in a sea tractor takes you over. One of our go to beaches.

Bantham (45 min drive)

There's more to Bantham beach than just sun, sand and ice cream. It's also one of the best surfing beaches in South Devon. The beach has got mellow waves for beginners and boggy boarders. equipment hire on the beach as well as some great food trucks.

Ansteys Cove (30 min drive)

A peaceful, shingle beach located on the coast path between Torquay and Babbacombe. There is a shop and cafe on the beach, which is set among wooded hills.



VALLEY CIRCULAR

13.7KM 953m ascent 4.19mins




- Start from the house and turn right out of the drive and follow the lane down to the first S bend
- Follow the lane past Swanaford house and vineyard
- Turning right off the lane at the Bridford Wood House sign and follow the path into the woods
- When you reach the Bridford Wood House, follow the footpath to the left round the property
- The footpath will meet a larger track, turn right and in a short distance the footpath begins again on the right
- · Follow this track until you reach the main road at Steps Bridge
- Turn right onto the main road and cross over the bridge rejoining the footpath on the left
- Follow the path until it splits follow bridal path to the right (don't follow the river path)
- Follow path until you reach a sign (on the right) with a path cutting back and up the hill
- Walk all the way up until the track cuts back on itself to the left then follow all the way back to the river
- Once back down turn right follow path until path cuts back on itself to the left, follow path along river back to the road at steps bridge
- Cross over bridge and follow road until you see the sign for the Youth Hostel (on the left)
- · Go up their drive and then follow path all the way to the top
- Out of the woods, walk up through the fields sticking to the left keep going until you come to gate on your left
- Through the gate you will be in small wood/orchard follow the track to the lane
- Once on lane turn left and follow it to the crossroads turn left follow the lane until you see footpath on the left up to Heltor rock

(views are amazing from the top and great spot to stop for some refreshment)

- Back on the lane turn left follow the lane till you see the sign for Burnicombe, (on the left) walk down their drive to the yard
- The footpath is through the gate on the right at the end of the drive
- Go through the gate at the top of the yard into the field and turn left
- Follow this path until you reach Lower Lowton Farm (you do pass through the yard)
- · Rejoin the path and follow until you reach the lane
- Turn right, follow lane towards Windhill Gate when you reach the T Junction turn left and follow road back to the house
- If you turn right and follow the lane up to Bridford (10 mins)
 the Bridford Inn awaits for a well deserved pint

CIRCULAR PUB WALK

6.2KM 270m ascent 1.41mins



- Out the drive turn right and follow the lane down to the main road at the bottom
- Cross over the small single track bridge and head to the corner the footpath runs through Sowton Mill
- Walk through the property sticking to the path. Follow path until you reach the lane
- · At the lane turn right and follow lane to the main road
- At Leighs Cross turn right and follow the main road over the bridge and onto the T Junction
- At T junction turn left and follow main road till you reach the pub on the left (Teign House Inn)
- On leaving the pub turn right and follow the main road until you get to Pound Lane on the left
- Follow the lane up the hill, just past the first turning left there
 is a drive on the right the footpath starts here
- Walk down the drive until you reach the gate on the left climb over and cut across the fields
- The path will narrow and lead you into a private garden (Many Waters) stick to the path which leads through the garden
- · Arriving at their drive follow it off the property to the lane
- Turn left and almost immediately you turn right and cut into
 Neadon Farm follow the path past the front of their house
- Follow the path through the field into the next and on to the lane
- · On the lane turn right and follow back to the house

DUNSFORD TEAROOM


5.7KM 332m ascent 1.42mins



- Start from the house and turn right out of the drive and follow the lane down to the first S bend
- · Follow the lane past Swanaford house and vineyard
- Turning right off the lane at the Bridford Wood House sign and follow the path into the woods
- Just before you reach the Bridford Wood House there is a footpath on the right follow this to the river
- Cross over the stepping stones, rejoin the path between the two buildings leading to the main road
- There are two gates across the road go through the one on the right and follow the path into the village
- Follow through the little cul-de-sac to main road running through the village, turn right and walk up the road
- · The tearoom is on the right opposite the church
- On leaving the tearoom turn right and head up the hill keeping an eye out for the footpath on the right
- Follow the footpath to the main road, on arriving at the main road turn left and follow road to the first corner
- Footpath begins on the opposite corner, follow it up hill and all the way to the lane, turn right
- Almost immediately footpath appears on the right, follow footpath down through field keeping to the left
- Follow through the woods down to the river, turn right and walk through Sowton Mill and back to the main road
- Turn left over the bridge, filter to the right up the lane and back to the house

BRIDFORD WOOD

2.6KM 225m ascent 0.54mins



- Start from the house and turn right out of the drive and follow the lane down to the first S bend
- Follow the lane past Swanaford house and vineyard
- Turning right off the lane at the Bridford Wood House sign and follow the path into the woods
- When you reach the Bridford Wood House, follow the footpath to the left round the property
- The footpath will meet a larger track, turn left up the track
- At the top of the track turn left and follow track along the ridge and back down to the track alongside the river
- Follow same route back to the house
